# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- In spring, summer and fall all new burials are top dressed and seeded immediately. Weather will affect germination rates.
- During winter months, graves are top dressed and seeded in the spring. Markers are not set because of frozen ground and this can be as early as October.
- Nearly all new graves will settle.
  However, graves are inspected, and
  additional soil is added as needed and
  then reseeded.

## **REGULATIONS:**

- All graves need to be level to the ground.
- Written permission to excavate, set or reset any monument must be obtained from the township.
- No graves shall be opened or closed without the supervision of Fairfield Township.
- In case of vandalism, the township will try to rise toppled headstones for the lot holder.
- Liquor may not be consumed on cemetery grounds.

# PURCHASING A PLOT AND PLACING A MEMORIAL AT FAIRFIELD CEMETERY

Plot Cost: Resident Nonresident

Lot \$250 \$450

Cremations can be 2 per plot or one casket and one cremation per plot.

Rite of burial is charged if interring in a grave with a prior interment. \$150

Deed transfer and registration: Crow Wing County Charges

Grave opening:	Summer	Winter
Casket	\$500	\$600
Cremation	\$250	\$300

These fees are subject to yearly updates.

Grave sites may have one above ground monument or stone per location.

#### **MEMORIALS**

### **SPECIFICATIONS:**

A memorial with or without a foundation is purchased from a memorial dealer chosen by the lot holder. The memorial dealer must talk to the cemetery supervisor describing the memorial exactly. He needs to have a signed order by the purchaser. If a lawn marker or foot stone is purchased, no foundation is necessary, and it is simply delivered to the cemetery. If a foundation is needed, the memorial dealer needs to deliver and set the foundation ten working days before the monument is set. After the foundation is completed, the memorial is set. The cemetery supervisor inspects the memorial once it is completed to be certain it meets the application's description.

Memorials are private property owned by each individual and are not insured against damage during regular maintenance by the township. They can be insured by an individual's private insurance policy. Monument measurements are from ground level to 32 inches high by 12 inches wide by 40 inches long and must fit within the grave site. All monuments must be placed on a concrete base large enough to allow a 4-inch border. All monuments must be made of material that cannot be disintegrated by the weather.
